GARBAGE COLLECTION

GARBAGE MUST BE PLACED CURBSIDE FOR COLLECTION NO EARLIER THAT 6 P.M.THE NIGHT BEFORE THE SCHEDULED COLLECTION AND NO LATER THAN 7 A.M.THE DAY OF THE SCHEDULED COLLECTION.

GARBAGE MUST BE PLACED CURBSIDE IN THE ISSUED ROLLING CART OR OTHER PREAPPROVED CONTANERS IN A LOCATION THAT IS EASILY ACCESSABLE AND NOT OBSTRUCTED FOR COLLECTION SUCH AS AT THE END OF THE DRIVEWAY.

COMPOSTING

All organic matter eventually decomposes. Composting speeds the process by providing an ideal environment for bacteria and other decomposing micro-organisms. The final product, humus or compost, looks and feels like fertile garden soil. This dark, crumbly, earthy-smelling material works wonders on all kinds of soil and provides vital nutrients to help plants grow and look better.

Many materials can be added to a compost pile, including leaves, grass clippings, straw, woody brush, vegetable and fruit scraps, coffee grounds, livestock manure, sawdust, and shredded paper. Do not use diseased plants, meat scraps that may attract animals, and dog or cat manure which can carry disease. Composting can be as simple or as involved as you would like, and depends on how much yard waste you have, how fast you want results, and the effort you are willing to invest.

Composting helps the Village of Tarrytown in a number of ways. It improves air quality by reducing the number of trips made by Village garbage trucks and the fuel they use in turn reducing air pollution. It also reduces costs involved in trucking and disposal fees. It improves soil fertility which helps the health of plants and the people that depend on them. Finally, it can help your bottom line by reducing the amount of topsoil and fertilizer you need to buy to help your garden. In short, by planning your compost pile now you can be helping both the environment and your wallet next spring!

In addition to the above information you or your landscape contractor can participate in the Love 'Em and Leave 'Em program by mulching your grass and leaves in place. For more information on this program you can visit www.lclny.org

YARD WASTE

Yard waste will be collected on Thursdays, unless stated otherwise. Leaves and grass clippings must be placed in bio-degradable paper bags and placed curbside for collection. Brush and branches up to four inches in diameter must be bundled and tied, bundles must not exceed three feet in length, and placed curbside for collection. Logs and stumps will not be collected.

BULK PICK UP

Small items that will fit in the issued rolling garbage cart will be taken with your garbage for collection. Larger items that will not fit in the issued rolling garbage cart such as furniture and mattresses call the Village Garage 914-631-0356 to schedule an appointment.

Mattresses and box springs must be either wrapped in plastic with the seams taped or placed in mattress bags. Mattress bags are available at Village Hall. The cost for the bags is three dollars each, and will fit up to a standard queen size mattress.

Construction debris of any kind will not be accepted. To dispose of construction debris check the Westchester County website for a list of local places that are permitted to accept such items.

Small Corded Appliances such as can openers, blow driers and toasters and coffee makers are no longer recyclable and can be disposed of in the regular garbage

COMMINGLE RECYCLING COLLECTION

Commingled glass, plastic and metal containers including all glass bottles and jars, all aluminum and metal containers including empty Aerosol cans and aluminum pie pans gable topped refrigerated food containers are recyclable.

All plastic containers marked with the following symbols are currently accepted.



Plastic items not marked with one of the above symbols are not recyclable and can be disposed of with the regular household garbage.

Non recycled materials include: CRYSTAL , WINDOW GLASS , MIRRORS, CERAMICS / OVENWARE, LIGHT BULBS, DRINKING GLASSES, DINNERWARE, BROKEN GLASS, FOAM, VINYL , PLASTIC BAGS AND WRAP, FLATWARE, CAPS AND LIDS, OIL/ PAINT CANS, BATTERIES, APPLIANCES, COAT HANGERS, ALUMINUM SIDING, SHEET AND SCRAP METAL,

All containers must be rinsed out and placed in your RECYCLING BOX or a CLEARLY MARKED CONTAINER for collection. Recycling must be out no later than 7 a.m. on the day of your scheduled collection.

COMMINGLE WILL NOT BE COLLECTED IN PLASTIC BAGS OF ANYTYPE.

PLASTIC SHOPPING BAGS CAN BE RETURNED TO YOUR LOCAL SUPER MARKET/ STORE FOR RECYCLING

COMMINGLED PAPER AND CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

For residential curbside pick-up, place newspapers, phone books, magazines, brochures, catalogs and junk mail, tissue boxes, cereal boxes, , toilet paper and paper towel rolls into brown paper bags or placed loosely in a clearly marked container. Newspapers can also be Bundled and tied. Bundles can be no more than 12 inches high and weigh no more than 40 lbs. Corrugated cardboard can be flattened and tied or place flattened boxes inside another corrugated box. Recycling must be out no later than 7 a.m. on the day of your scheduled collection. No tape or plastic bags.

NON RECYCLED MATERIALS INCLUDE: HARD COVER BOOKS, PAPER PLATES AND CUPS, STYROFOAM AND FOOD STAINED GRAY CARDBOARD SUCH AS PIZZA BOXES

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

CHRISTMAS TREES WILL BE COLLECTED ON THURSDAYS THROUGHOUT THE MONTH OF JANUARY. TREES WITH TREE STANDS, LIGHTS, METAL WIRES OR IN BAGS WILL **NOT** BE COLLECTED

CELL PHONE RECYCLING

CELL PHONES CONTAIN HIGHLY TOXIC MATERIALS AND NEED TO BE DISPOSED OF PROPERLY. AS OF JUNE 2006 IT HAS BEEN AGAINST THE LAW TO THROW A CELL PHONE IN THE GARBAGE. VIOLATORS CAN BE FINED UP TO \$250. YOU MAY DROP OFF UNWANTED CELL PHONES AT VILLAGE HALL, FIRST FLOOR NEAR THE TREASURER'S OFFICE

BULK METAL COLLECTION

BULK METAL ITEMS ARE COLLECTED CURBSIDE ON WEDNESDAYS BY APPOINTMENT ONLY. TO SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT CALL THE VILLAGE GARAGE 631-0356, PLEASE LEAVE A MESSAGE WITH YOUR NAME, ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER. ANY METAL ITEMS SUCH AS LAWN MOWERS OR SNOW BLOWERS MUST BE EMPTY OF GAS AND OIL PRIOR TO BEING PLACED AT THE CURB FOR PICK-UP

MATTRESS COLLECTION

ALL MATTRESSES AND BOX SPRINGS MUST EITHER BE WRAPPED IN PLASTIC AND TAPED CLOSED OR PLACED IN PLASTIC MATTRESS BAGS TAPED CLOSED AND PLACED CURBSIDE FOR COLLECTION. MATTRESS BAGS ARE AVAILABLE AT THE VILLAGE GARAGE LOCATED AT 4 DIVISION STREET. COST OF THE BAGS ARE \$3.00 PER BAG WITH PAYMENT MADE AT THE TREASURES OFFICE IN VILLAGE HALL.

OLD CLOTHING

OLD CLOTHING CAN BE DONATED TO ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS THE SALVATION ARMY OR PLACED IN THE TEXTILE CONTAINER AT THE DPW FACILITY.

STREET LIGHT NOT WORKING

TO REPORT A STREET LIGHT NOT WORKING CALL DPW 631-0356 AND GIVE THE POLE NUMBER W-# OR NYT-# ON WOODEN POLES. FOR ALUMINUM POLES PLEASE GIVE THE NEAREST STREET ADDRESS

DISCOLORED WATER

There are a few reasons why your water may be discolored. The two most common are either a fire hydrant in your area has been opened or there is a water main break. In case of discolored water, let the water run in a sink for 10 to 15 minutes, if the discoloration does not go away call the village garage at 914-631-0356 between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.. After hours, report discolored water to the Police Department 914-631-5544.

HOUSEHOLD CHEMICALS

Westchester County has a permanent facility in Valhalla, New York that is open year round for disposal of household chemicals. For instructions on items that are not acceptable and how to dispose of them, call the Westchester County Household Chemical Hotline at (914) 813-5425 or visit their website at <http://environment.westchestergov.com/facilities/h-mrf>.

Some accepted items include: Most automotive fluids, flammable liquids, polishes, pesticides and insecticides, swimming pool chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, compact fluorescent bulbs, Expired or unused Pharmaceuticals, E-Waste, Propane Tanks, Batteries (car, alkaline, rechargeable and button)

IMPORTANT NOTICE

WESTCHESTER COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

RADIOLOGICAL MEDICATION RESIDUALS CANNOT BE DISPOSED OF IN THE GARBAGE

If you or your pets are receiving medical treatment involving radioactive materials, all residuals or personal items that could collect body fluids should be returned to the hospital or health care facility where you or your pet received treatment, for proper disposal. Your doctor will advise you how long after treatment you will need to continue taking these precautions. These items include: Diapers, excreta, kitty litter, sanitary napkins, tampons, tissues or any other product that would be used to absorb bodily fluids.

SHARPS DISPOSAL

Proper disposal of sharps is important to the safety of the sharps user and to the workers who handle trash. Follow these guidelines to keep yourself and others safe. Use a leak proof, shatterproof and puncture proof container with a screw top such as a plastic laundry soap container labeled SHARPS. Place the lancet or needle and syringe in the container immediately and secure the screw top on the container. When the container is full apply tape around the neck and top of the container. The preferred method of disposal is to take the full container to a Sharps disposal site listed on the Westchester County Website.

Never place SHARPS in with the recycling.

SNOW REMOVAL

As property owners, you are responsible for the removal of snow and ice from sidewalks contiguous to your property.
Code of the Village of Tarrytown, Chapter 259-37, "Removal of Snow and Ice".

A. The owner or occupant of any premise shall cause the contiguous sidewalk and in the case of multifamily dwellings, all driveways and access and exit roads on the premises to be cleared of snow and ice within eighteen hours after such snowfall shall have ceased or ice shall have formed except in the case of properties in the Restricted Retail Zoning Districts and the Neighborhood Shopping Districts in the Village, which shall have the snow and ice removed at all times between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.

B. Where the snow has melted and shall be frozen or where there has been an ice storm and the contiguous sidewalks shall be frozen, the ice shall be removed within two hours. The two hour period shall not apply between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. Should the snow have melted and shall be frozen or where there has been an ice storm and the contiguous sidewalk shall be frozen during the period of 10:00 p.m and 5:00 a.m, the snow and ice shall be removed by 7:00 a.m. If the melted snow and ice shall be frozen to a degree that it cannot be removed within said period by customary means, the owner or occupant of the abutting premise shall cause salt, sand, ashes, sawdust or other suitable material to be strewn upon said sidewalks, driveways and access and exit roads within said period. The said sidewalk shall as soon thereafter as weather conditions permit be thoroughly clear of the snow and ice.

LEAF COLLECTION

BULK LEAF COLLECTION FOR 2019 WILL START ON NOVEMBER 12, 2020 AND WILL END ON DECEMBER 13, 2020, OR WHEN THE LEAVES ON THE LAST SCHEDULED ROUTE ARE COLLECTED. ANY LEAVES PLACED CURBSIDE BEFORE OR AFTER YOUR BULK PICK-UP MUST BE PLACED IN BIO-DEGRADABLE PAPER BAGS. LEAVES PLACED CURBSIDE FOR BULK COLLECTION MUST BE FREE OF LARGE ITEMS SUCH AS STICKS AND BRANCHES. **LEAVES MUST BE PILED ON THE CURB AND NOT IN THE GUTTER, OR IN THE STREET.** SEE THE ATTACHED BULK LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULE FOR YOUR COLLECTION DATE.

The hours for Bulk leaf collection are 7:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. according to the schedule. On the day of your scheduled collection please remove your vehicles from the street to allow the crews to collect the leaves. Due to conditions beyond our control, your scheduled day for leaf collection may be delayed. Any questions about the schedule please call DPW at 631-0356.

The following rules apply to leaf collection and will be strictly enforced:

1. Leaves must not be placed at the curb prior to the weekend before your scheduled collection.
2. Leaves must be piled at the edge of the curb and not in the roadway.
3. Leaf piles mixed with brush and other large items will not be collected.
4. All leaves placed curbside prior to the beginning and after the conclusion of bulk leaf collection must be placed in biodegradable paper bags.
